TOPIC: The Situation in the Middle East: Israel and Palestine

1 *The Security Council,*

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3 *Strongly emphasizing* that there will be no lasting solution to the Israel-Palestine conflict through
4 solely military means,

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6 *Expressing* its continuing concern with the grave situation in the Middle East,

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8 *Having heard* the concerns expressed by the representatives of the State of Israel and the State of
9 Palestine,

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11 *Deeply concerned* by the lack of security and threats of violence that civilians must experience in
12 both the State of Israel and the State of Palestine,

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14 *Guided by* Article 2, Paragraph 7 of the *United Nations Charter*, which establishes that nothing
15 contained in the present Charter shall authorize the United Nations to intervene in matters which
16 are within the domestic jurisdiction of any state,

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18 *Calling attention* to Article 1, Paragraph 1 of the United Nations Charter, which creates the basis
19 for friendly and open relations between states,

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21 *Recalling* Security Council resolution 242 (1967), which forms the basis of Israeli-Palestinian
22 negotiations on the idea of land for peace and emphasizes that territory acquired by war is
23 unacceptable to the causes of a just and lasting peace,

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25 *Further recalling* Security Council resolution 446 (1979) and 471 (1980), highlighting the
26 importance of the Fourth Geneva Convention,

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28 *Reaffirming* the report by the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development on the
29 benefits of having a strengthened Palestinian economy,

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31 1. *Decides* to establish the United Nations Mission in Palestine (UNMIP) as a stabilizing
32 force, for a period of one years, consisting of 20,000 United Nations Personnel, including
33 up to 300 military observers and 180 staff officers, including formed units designed to
34 assist in the maintenance of law and order through Palestine, including the civilian
35 component;
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37 2. *Proclaims* that UNMIP shall have the following mandate:
- 38 a. to observe and monitor the checkpoints within the state of Palestine, including
39 Palestine's access to the Eastern Mediterranean,
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41 b. to establish and maintain continuous liaison with the State of Palestine's civil police
42 forces,

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- c. to prevent the acquisition of weapons of violent non-state actors acting against the State of Israel within the operational zone of UNMIP,
 - d. to assist in providing security at key Palestinian government installations and support Palestine's civil police force in integrating the 135 UN Rule of Law Indicators by
 - i. the UN Rule of Law Indicator Implementation Guide and Project Tool,
 - ii. recommendations from the UN Interregional Crime and Justice Research Institute (UNICRI)
 - iii. full adherence to the Department of Peace Keeping Operations (DPKO) training and policy division framework and toolkit,
 - iv. to deliver regular reports to the Security Council on the progress of supporting the Palestinian civil police force;
 - e. to protect United Nations personnel, facilities, installations and equipment,
 - f. to monitor the flow of essential goods, as defined by the United Nations Relief and Works Agency into Palestine through pre-existing checkpoints subject to consultation with both the Israeli Defense Forces and the Palestinian Security Forces,
 - g. to contribute towards international efforts to protect and promote human rights in Palestine, with particular attention to vulnerable groups, including the internally displaced, women, children and the disabled with the oversight of the Quartet that would then give a report to the Security Council,
 - h. to assist the government of Palestine in monitoring the police force of Palestine in a manner consistent with democratic policing,
 - i. to assist the government of Palestine in working towards restoring appropriate control of their natural resources and civic administration;
5. *Urges* Palestine and Israel to continue engaging in bilateral negotiations and work towards a peace agreement with suggested topics including mutually agreed-upon land transfers, settlement of Palestinian refugees across the Middle East, and establishment of trade agreements between Israel and Palestine::
 6. *Endorses* foreign direct investment in commercial, agricultural, financial, and infrastructure as a way of further stabilizing the Palestinian economy and as a means to enhance the quality of life of the Palestinian people;
 7. *Requests* Israel lift the blockade on the Gaza Strip to allow United Nations agencies and other non-governmental organizations to carry out their work without persecution.
